City Sightseeing Tour of Berlin

Starting at the ICC the tour will pass the Kurfürstendamm, one of Berlin's main boulevards, and the Philharmonic Hall, Federal Library and National Gallery. See the Reichstag - seat of the German parliament - which has been reconstructed from 1994-1999 and got a huge new glass dome.

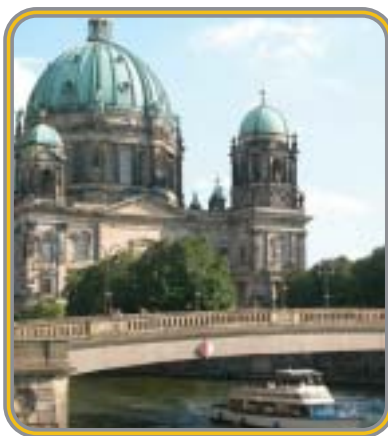
Continue to the boulevard "Unter den Linden" passing the State Opera House, Humboldt University, the Museum of German History, the red brick City Hall and the Pergamon Museum. Brandenburg Gate and Bellevue Palace will also be highlights of the tour before returning to the congress venue.

Berlin from the Spree Canals

From the ICC, you will be taken to the Schlossbrücke pier which is located behind the famous Charlottenburg Palace.



Here you will board a public sightseeing boat. See Berlin from an unusual and fascinating perspective during this 80-minutes cruise on the Spree River and the Landwehr Canal.

Highlights of the tour will be the Reichstag (seat of the German Parliament), Bellevue Palace, Museum Island, the Berlin Cathedral.

After disembarking at the pier Jannowitzbrücke the bus will take you back to the ICC.

Monday 16, May 2011

Half Day Excursion to Potsdam

Depart by bus from the ICC to Potsdam, the city which best reflects the brilliance of Prussian history in many different periods.

Visit one of the castles of Sanssouci and their beautiful garden. The whole complex has been built as the summer residence for the Prussian royal family. Frederick the Great loved the



small town of Potsdam and created the first summer palace over there in the 18th century. Many other residences have been built by his heirs in Potsdam until the beginning of 20th century.

A short bus tour through Potsdam including the early 18th century settlement "Holland Quarter" and the Russian colony "Alexandrovka" will follow before returning to the congress venue.

Tuesday, 17 May 2011

Walking Tour of the Eastern City Center

A bus will take you from the congress venue to the Scheunenviertel. This district used to be out of the city's border in the 16th century and many Jews and Russians settled here,

building very narrow streets and houses with up to 8 courtyards. When the wall came down many artists moved to the district, squatters occupied houses, illegal bars and discotheques opened creating a vital atmosphere. Pass the Jewish Synagogue with its golden dome.

Continue with a walk to Museum Island, the German State Opera, the Gendarmenmarkt and Friedrichstraße. Your bus will pick you up here and take you to the congress venue.

Jewish Berlin

The tour will start at the ICC from where you head out to the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe. It is located in the centre of Berlin and is Germany's central Holocaust memorial site, a place for remembrance and commemoration of six million victims. The Memorial consists of the Field of Stelae designed by architect Peter Eisenman and the underground Information Centre and is maintained by a Federal Foundation.

Afterwards the tour will continue to the "Spandauer Vorstadt" in the centre of East Berlin around Hackescher Markt. Since it was built in 1866, the New Synagogue is located here. It has always been and still is the symbol of Jewish culture in Berlin. Since the 90s, a lot of Jewish restaurants, cafés, institutions - cultural and educational - and a Jewish community have settled here.

During a short walking tour pass by shops, restaurants and cafés around Hackescher Markt. The guide will give you behind-the-scenes information.

The bus will pick you up at the New Synagogue and Centrum Judaicum and take you to the "shooting star" among Berlin's museums - the Jewish Museum in Kreuzberg, designed by Daniel Libeskind. You will get an interesting insight into the 2.000 year old history of the Jewish people in Germany. A tour of the museum will be arranged and afterwards transfer back to the ICC.

Controversial Berlin

During the forty years of Berlin's division, the two halves of the city underwent completely different developments. Most of the after-effects of this period are still very apparent today and are illustrated by your guide on the tour. Visit the Checkpoint Charlie Museum located directly at the former border crossing from West to East Berlin. The impressive exhibition shows interesting details of German history during GDR times. Afterwards continue to the East Side Gallery which was created by painters from all over the world. It is Europe's only and most famous open air gallery painted on original pieces of the wall.

Excursion to the Spreewald

Depart to the nature reserve "Spreewald", an extraordinary forest hiding a labyrinth of Spree canals. The Spreewald still has some endangered and rare plants and trees as well as animals and birds. Only very few roads lead to this district. The usual traffic is done on punts. You will discover



this romantic area on a boat that is moved by the Spreewald men dressed in their traditional punting costumes. The punt tour will start and end at the

village of Lübbenau with a stop at Lehde where you will visit an open air museum showing the culture and traditional costumes of the Spreewald area. Lunch will be arranged at a local restaurant. Afterwards the bus will bring you to back to the ICC in Berlin.

Excursion to Dresden

Excursion to Dresden, capital of the province of Saxony and also known as Elb-Florence due to its many museums and art

A walk through the old city will lead you past the Zwinger, the Semper Opera, the Palace, the

more than 8 years of reconstruction. During lunch you will meet the "Countess of Cosel", maitresse of August the Strong, telling you about her eventful life in Saxony in the 18 century. Visit the Green Vault at the Dresden Palace, the treasure house of the Saxon electors.

Throughout the afternoon you will have the opportunity to explore the city on your own before the bus will return to the ICC in Berlin. Driving time to Dresden will be 3 hours.

Excursion to Potsdam

Depart to Potsdam, the city which best reflects the brilliance of Prussian history in many different periods.

Visit one of the palaces of Sanssouci and their beautiful garden. The whole complex has been built as summer residence for the Prussian royal family. Meet "Frederick the Great" in his historical costume in front of the Palais Sanssouci, who will give you a short impression about Prussian history and the Prussian royal family. Lunch at the Palace Cecilienhof or the Restaurant Mövenpick.

Visit of Palace Cecilienhof, built between 1913 and 1917 in the style of an English

country manor for the family of the Crown Prince. In 1945 the Potsdam Agreement was signed between the Allied Powers here. Afterwards short bus tour through Potsdam. Pass the early 18th century settlement "Holland Quarter" with its colourful houses and the Russian colony "Alexandrovka".
